

ABSTRAK

Upaya Meningkatkan *Patient Safety* Dengan Sosialisasi SOP Dan Edukasi Pencegahan Pasien Risiko Jatuh Menggunakan Media Poster Di Ruang IGD RSUD Welas Asih Provinsi Jawa Barat

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Pasien jatuh merupakan salah satu insiden keselamatan pasien tertinggi di rumah sakit dan berpotensi menimbulkan cedera serius bahkan kematian. Meskipun sistem keselamatan telah diterapkan, masih ditemukan kurangnya implementasi sarana dan edukasi, seperti tanda risiko jatuh yang tidak terpasang serta minimnya pemahaman pasien dan keluarga. Tujuan Penelitian ini bertujuan untuk meningkatkan keselamatan pasien (*patient safety*) melalui upaya pencegahan risiko jatuh dengan pendekatan sosialisasi SOP dan edukasi menggunakan media poster di ruang IGD RSUD Welas Asih Provinsi Jawa Barat. Metode Studi ini menggunakan pendekatan deskriptif dengan metode observasi, wawancara, dan implementasi intervensi. Kegiatan dilakukan pada Juli–Agustus 2025, mencakup edukasi kepada perawat dan keluarga pasien, pemasangan tanda risiko jatuh (gelang kuning dan segitiga kuning), serta sosialisasi SOP melalui media poster di ruang IGD. Hasil Ditemukan bahwa setelah pelaksanaan intervensi, terdapat peningkatan kepatuhan perawat dalam menerapkan SOP risiko jatuh serta peningkatan kesadaran keluarga pasien terhadap tindakan pencegahan. Fasilitas fisik juga diperbaiki, seperti penguncian bed dan pemasangan plang serta tanda peringatan lantai licin. Upaya edukatif dan visualisasi SOP terbukti efektif dalam meningkatkan partisipasi aktif perawat dan keluarga pasien terhadap keselamatan pasien, terutama dalam mencegah kejadian jatuh. Kesimpulan sosialisasi SOP dan edukasi melalui media poster merupakan strategi sederhana namun efektif dalam meningkatkan *patient safety* di IGD, khususnya dalam mencegah pasien risiko jatuh.

ABSTRACT

Efforts to Improve Patient Safety by Socializing SOPs and Education on Fall Risk Prevention for Patients Using Posters in the Emergency Room of Welas Asih Regional Hospital, West Java Province

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Patient falls are one of the highest patient safety incidents in hospitals and have the potential to cause serious injury or even death. Although safety systems have been implemented, there is still a lack of implementation of facilities and education, such as unattached fall risk signs and minimal understanding of patients and families. Purpose This study aims to improve patient safety through fall risk prevention efforts using the SOP socialization approach and education using posters in the emergency room of Welas Asih Regional Hospital, West Java Province. Method This study uses a descriptive approach with observation, interviews, and intervention implementation methods. Activities were carried out in July–August 2025, including education for nurses and patient families, installation of fall risk signs (yellow bracelets and yellow triangles), and SOP socialization through posters in the emergency room. Results It was found that after the intervention implementation, there was an increase in nurse compliance in implementing fall risk SOPs and an increase in patient family awareness of preventive measures. Physical facilities were also improved, such as bed locks and the installation of signs and signs warning of slippery floors. Educational efforts and SOP visualization have proven effective in increasing the active participation of nurses and patient families in patient safety, especially in preventing falls. In conclusion, socialization of SOPs and education through poster media is a simple but effective strategy in improving patient safety in the ER, especially in preventing patients at risk of falling.
